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All-female construction crew

(Sept. 22) Glendale, AZ - Charlie Ellis, Founder and CEO of Operation Enduring Gratitude and governing board member for Western Maricopa Education Center (West-MEC) - a public career technical education district - is set to host an all-woman construction crew to lay concrete for a sidewalk and build a wheelchair ramp for a military veteran on Saturday, Oct. 3.

The crew of about ten women will build the ramp and sidewalk for Olivia, the widow of an Air Force veteran, at around 7:30 a.m. at her home in Phoenix.

Ellis's Operation Enduring Gratitude group has provided working sidewalks and wheelchair ramps to nearly 60 homes of veterans and veteran widows, like Olivia, since 2014.

The construction workers and students in this project include high school students at West-MEC, college students and industry professionals. Only this event will be all women, celebrating October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month and women in construction. He hopes the event can become an annual tradition on the first Saturday of October.

"We want to cast an image that women have a place in the construction industry, and it's a way to highlight West-MEC and our partnership with the construction program at ASU," Ellis said.

"With something like this, the industry can show students real-world application of the skills they learn in school."
